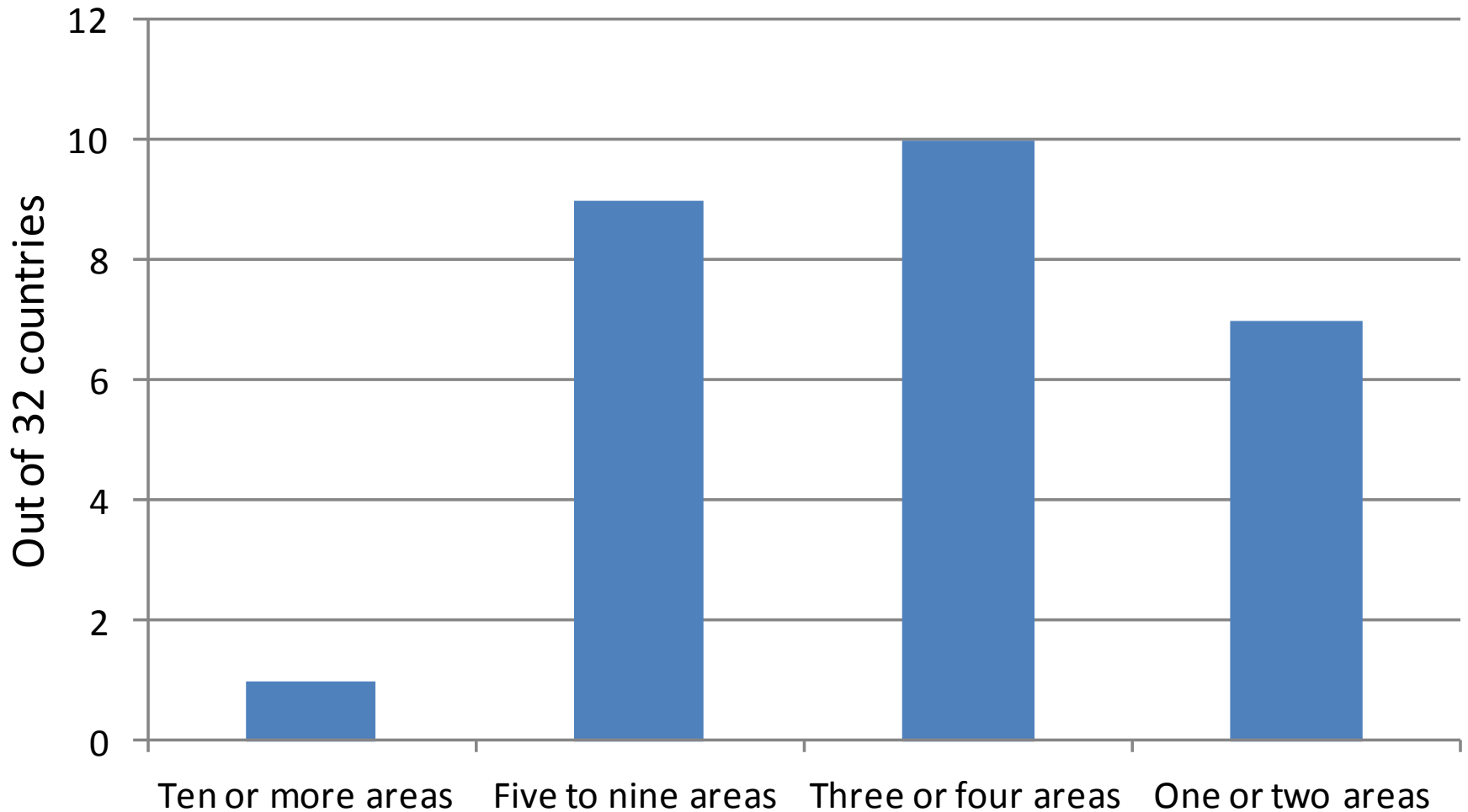

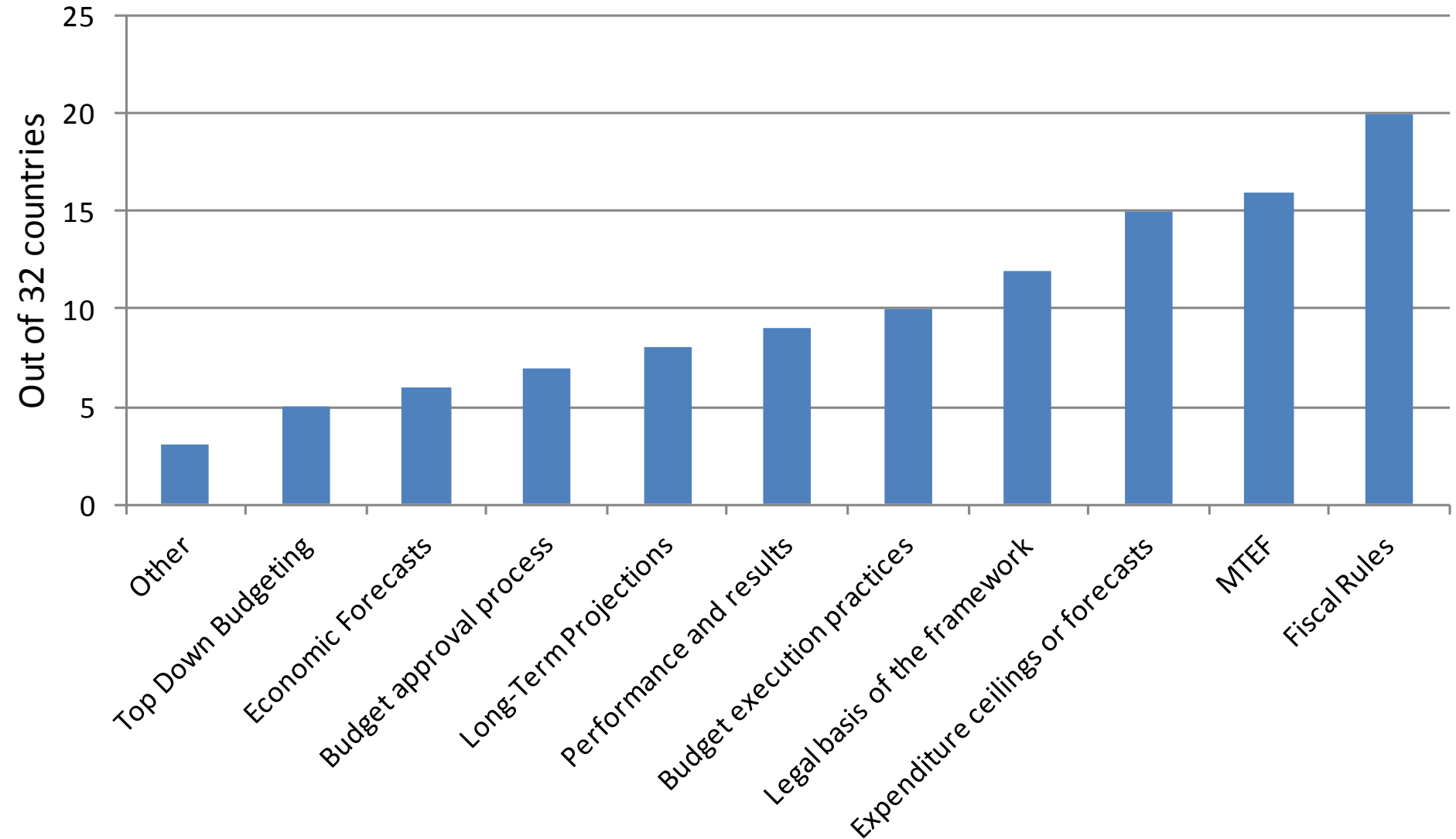
# Content

# No. of countries that have implemented changes in budgetary institutional frameworks since 2008



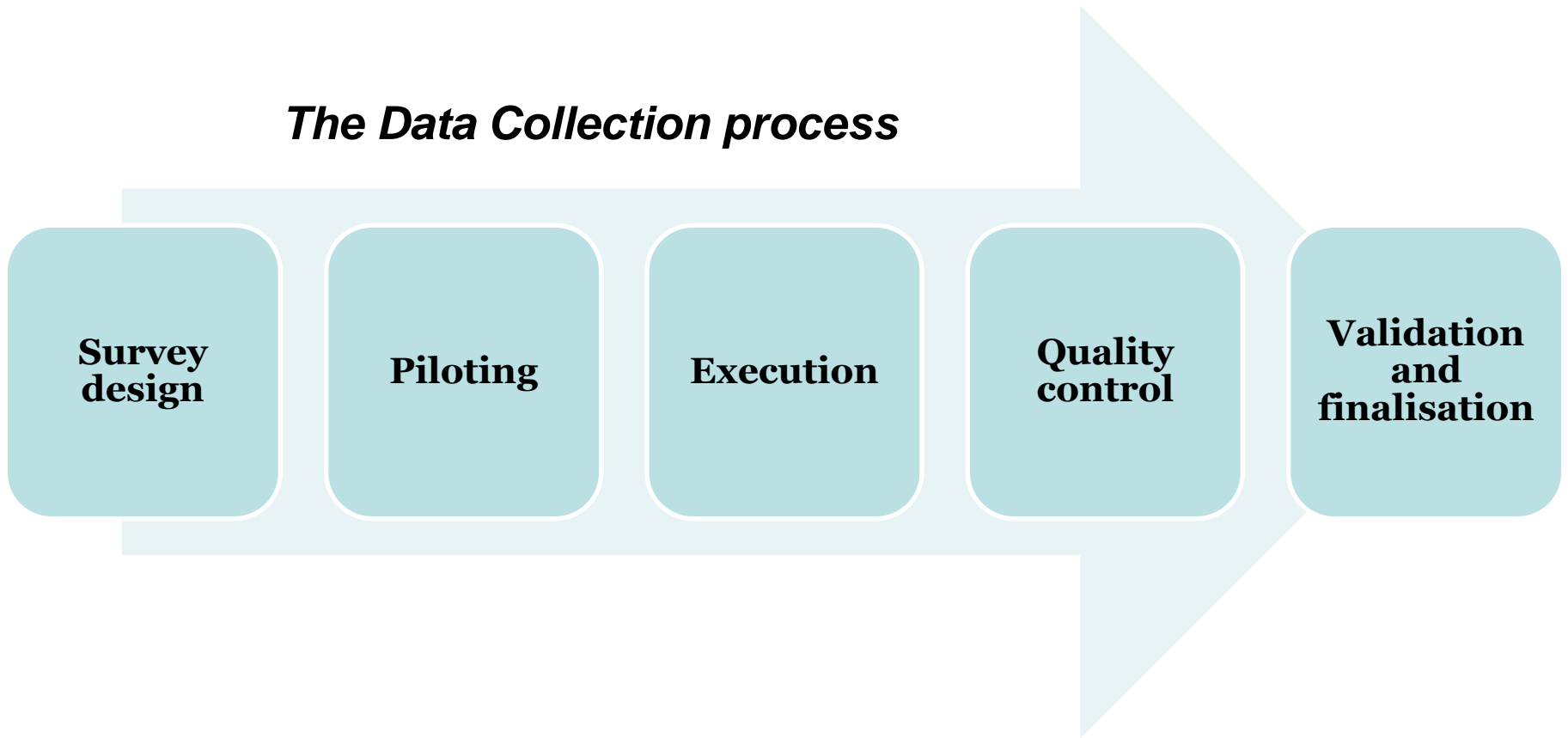
# Updating the OECD Budget Practices Database (i)

- OECD Budgeting Surveys conducted approximately every 4 years;
- Distributed to different networks to reduce response burden and improve accuracy of data received

<b>Budget practices and procedures (formulation, approval and execution)</b>	Summer 2012	Working Party of Senior Budget Officials

<b>Fiscal Councils and role of Legislature in budgeting</b>	Fall/winter 2012	Network of Parliamentary Budget Officials

# Updating the OECD Budget Practices Database (iii)

- Key for evidence-based policy making (e.g. establishing linkages between budget practices and results like more sustainable public finances, a more efficiency public sector and greater trust in government).
- Growing country coverage: in addition to OECD– LAC (IDB), MENA (OECD), Africa (CABRI), Eastern Europe (World Bank)
- ***Other key outputs of data:***
  - *Free, publically available database online*
  - *Budget Country reviews*
  - *Government at a Glance 2013: Composite indices/rankings and country fact sheets*
  - *OECD Journal on Budgeting*
